Host Facility: Innovation Depot



The Innovation Depot, 1500 1st Ave N, Birmingham, AL 35203, serves as an anchor for the city's "Entrepreneurial District". It's connected across the Railroad Reservation and midtown to the UAB campus by a "green street" on 14th Street South which passes alongside the Railroad Park. The entire district has a special overlay zoning to encourage entrepreneurial activity as an engine for dense mid-rise urban development.

The building's architectural design won an Honor Citation from the Gulf States chapter of the American Institute of Architects and a Merit Award for Adaptive Reuse from AIA Birmingham.
